
Captain James Cook

Captain Cook was born on the 7th of November in 1728 in England.


He was an explorer who journeyed all around the world mapping new places. He often took scientists with him including botanist Joseph Banks who would document native plants and animals with pictures and written observations.

Cook was the first captain to stop scurvy by giving his crew fruit filled with Vitamin C.

He was killed by a mob of native people in 1779 in Hawaii.
